

New Public Safety Building Update

The process of acquiring an approximate six-acre tract of land on Ira E. Woods Avenue where the new public safety building will be located is progressing and the design process has begun. The new location is only a short distance from the current police building at 307 West Dallas Road and provides a convenient and central location that will accommodate police personnel, detention, fire, administration, emergency operations center, municipal

court, and information technology and was approved by voters in November.

Brinkley Sargent has been selected to lead design efforts based on their experience designing similar facilities throughout the country. The design process is expected to take approximately 14 months with actual construction of the building to begin in October 2014.

SMOKE ALARMS SAVE LIVES

A working smoke alarm is taken for granted and we sometimes abuse them but when they work, they could save your life.

Recently, a Grapevine family experienced a fire that they thought would never happen to them. A working smoke alarm activated and awoke a sleeping family member and provided time for them to escape the fire in their home.

Each year the Grapevine Fire Department tests and installs smoke detectors in homes throughout the City. In fact, over the last few years Grapevine Firefighters have installed over a 1,000 smoke alarms in homes in Grapevine. 
CITY-WIDE BRUSH RECYCLING PILOT PROGRAM

The City of Grapevine and Republic Services have made arrangements to implement a pilot program to study the effectiveness of offering a brush recycling service city wide. Two brush and bulk route areas have been selected to participate in this pilot program.

Starting Wednesday, September 4 service within the two study areas (shaded on map) will change to allow brush to be diverted from the landfill to a recycling facility. Tree limbs, clean brush and yard waste will be collected on the first, third, and fifth Wednesday of the month (9/4, 9/18, 10/2, 10/16, 10/30, 11/6 & 11/20). Leaves and grass clippings must be put into "mulchable" bags, which are large/tall brown paper bags that can be

purchased at stores such as Home Depot, Lowe's & Walmart. Normal brush and bulk service will be offered on the second and fourth Wednesday of each month (9/11, 9/25, 10/9, 10/23, 11/13 & 11/27).

Simply place these items at the back of the curb by 7 am on the appropriate Wednesday for collection. The pilot program is scheduled for three months (September -November). Note: Bulky items and trash items that would otherwise contaminate recyclable clean brush and yard waste will only be collected on the second and fourth Wednesday of the month in the pilot program areas. 



West Nile Prevention

Last year, West Nile Virus was prevalent all over the Metroplex. In an effort to combat the virus this year, the City of Grapevine, in conjunction with Tarrant County and neighboring cities, is taking a proactive stance to prevent the spread of West Nile Virus by increasing the number of mosquito traps for testing and frequency of testing, promoting public education early on, and actively monitoring standing pools of water.

Although North Texas normally receives very little rainfall this time of year, there are a couple of other sources of water that can provide the perfect breeding ground for mosquitoes such as pool discharges, untreated and untended pools, and lawn irrigation. By the end of

July there were five positive mosquito results that existed in the county. Three of those were in Grapevine. City staff treated the infected areas accordingly in June and July.

Grapevine currently has water restrictions in place due to drought conditions in North Texas. These restrictions also create the benefit of reducing mosquito habitat in the city. Please follow water restrictions to ease the burden of the drought and reduce the mosquito-borne disease risk in our city.

If you have any questions about water conservation, vector control or pool discharges, please contact Environmental Services at 817.410.3330.

In order to slow the spread, residents should practice the 4 Ds:

TAKE CONTROL 
Stop West Nile Virus
In your yard • In your community
Dump standing water • Use repellent • Dress for dusk and dawn

- *Try to stay indoors during DUSK and DAWN,*
- *DRESS in long sleeves and long pants when possible,*
- *Wear bug repellent with DEET, and*
- *DRAIN standing water.*

WATER RESTRICTIONS STILL IN EFFECT

Please remember that Stage 1 water restrictions are still in effect. Residents may water their lawns two days a week. The days are set up based on your street address. To see what days you are permitted to water, please visit grapevintexas.gov. Watering can only take place on your specified days, but not between the hours of 10 am and 6 pm.
