More Quality of Life Improvement Projects Soon Underway

In November of 2006, voters in Grapevine approved a one-half cent sales tax increase to fund a Crime Control and Prevention District. The approval freed up millions of dollars in the general fund to be used for quality-of-life improvements in Grapevine. Two major projects that will be underway during fiscal year 2014 are the playgrounds that will serve residents surrounding the GRACE facility and Lakeview Park areas.

The GRACE playground will be a wonderful addition to the patrons that visit GRACE and the residents in the area. The playground will be tucked between the GRACE building on Shady Brook Drive and the trees on the south side of the building. The native Post Oaks will provide natural shade for the children.

Lakeview Park is located on the shores of Lake Grapevine, north

of Kimball Road. The park had a playground when the City took over operations from the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers. The playground was a wooden structure and did not meet current safety standards. City crews razed the playground with the intent of rebuilding/replacing it. Lakeview Park is heavily used by residents and visitors. Both playgrounds will feature separate play components for children ages 2-5 and 5-12 years. We look forward to both new playgrounds being complete in early 2014.

Other projects being funded include: Meadowmere Soccer Restroom facility – currently serviced with port-a-potties. This addition in the middle of the complex close to the current shade canopy will be a big benefit to the soccer complex for league and tournament play.

Meadowmere Park Pond and Irrigation System – this installation of a pumping system will be similar to the one at Oak Grove Soccer Complex. Instead of using treated water for irrigation, this system will pump raw water from Lake Grapevine into the pond at Lonesome Dove. The water will be used for irrigating the soccer fields at Meadowmere. The economic payback of using raw water instead of treated water is estimated at 12 years.

Golf Course Restrooms – the two restrooms being replaced are beyond repair and will be reinstalled with modular facilities similar to those used in the parks.

Library Remodeling for Study rooms – the library will be expanding the number of study rooms by converting a staff area into four quiet study rooms for public use.

Water Restrictions – Anticipated Entering Stage 2

Due to the continued drought situation, there is a strong possibility that the City will enter Stage 2 water restrictions in the coming weeks. This will further limit outdoor watering with sprinklers and irrigation systems to once per week. Please monitor the City website or visit savetarrantwater.com to keep apprised of this potential risk.

With the increasing use of smart phones, the ability to report problems within our homes becomes so much easier. Did you know that you can report a power outage in your home and view the approximate time for repair? ALWAYS BAG OR COMPOST LEAVES! BLOWING LEAVES CLOGS DRAINS

Fall has arrived! Leaves are falling and yards are filling up. Instead of blowing your leaves into the street where they can clog storm drains and cause flooding or add unnecessary nutrients to creeks causing fish kills, bag your leaves or use them for mulch. Blowing them into the street puts a burden on the storm drain system and the street sweepers that periodically clean our streets. They are swept in a pattern that allows the City to sweep residential streets a minimum of four times per year.

Therefore, relying on the street sweeper to remove your leaves from the street means they could be there for a while. So protect our streets from flooding and our creeks from fish kills and bag your leaves!

GRAPEVINE GOES GREENER!

RECYCLE CARTS:

The City of Grapevine continues to increase its efforts to become a cleaner, greener Grapevine following the success of a cart recycling program implemented in November 2012. Approximately 11,000 homes received recycle roll carts with lids that are picked up on a weekly basis from the curb. Since the introduction of the cart, there has been an 84 percent increase in recyclables collected.

MORE ITEMS ELIGIBLE FOR RECYCLING:


Allied Waste/Republic Services continues to expand the list of recyclables by adding pizza boxes, milk & juice cartons. The cartons have a simple, classic design that has been part of daily life for generations. They are light-weight and made mainly made from paper. Additionally, to address the growing problem of grocery bags littering our cities and waterways, Republic's North Texas Recycling Center has incorporated a film recovery system in their new material recovery facility in Fort Worth giving the City of Grapevine the ability to add grocery bags to the list of acceptable items.

RECYCLE PILOT PROGRAM:

In July 2013, the City Council approved a three-month brush/bulk pilot project designed to get more GREEN material out of landfills and add to the City's recycling efforts. The pilot project affects two residential routes which began in September and will run through November. The program includes tree limbs and brush, leaves and grass clippings. The service is provided on the second and fourth Wednesday. A mailer was sent to approximately 2,736 homes on routes where the Pilot Program is being offered.

Life Saving Trauma Kits Implemented

A progressive trend for law enforcement agencies is to provide their officers with life-saving trauma kits and the associated first aid or combat medical training. Grapevine has taken the first steps in acquiring the necessary tools to provide each officer with a field trauma kit and a combat tourniquet.

Police personnel recruited local surgeon Dr. Shahid Shafi to be a consultant on the project. Dr. Shafi, prior to coming to Grapevine was an ER Trauma Surgeon at Parkland Hospital

in Dallas for six years. Grapevine was fortunate to have Dr. Shafi's expertise and input at no cost to the Department.

The field trauma pack consists of hemostatic [blood clotting] gauze, SWAT-T multi-purpose tourniquet/bandage and nitrile gloves. The combat tourniquet, separate from the trauma pack, is an easy to use, military grade tourniquet. In the event of a mass casualty, similar to the recent Boston bombing or a school shooting, our officers can render aid that could save the life of a victim when minutes or even seconds count.

Santa Cops

Once again, this fall the Grapevine Police Department will be full-steam-ahead with its annual Santa Cops Program. The Santa Cops program delivers toys to economically disadvantaged children in the community. In 2012, the Santa Cops program brought toys to 428 families and 1421 children in the GCISD area.

The Santa Cops program is funded entirely by local donations. It is organized and implemented by Grapevine Police Officers and V.I.P.s, their families, and community volunteers. Anyone interested in donating a new, unwrapped toy can take it to the police department, at 307 W. Dallas Road, or to several other drop boxes located throughout the city. Drop boxes will be located at the Senior Activities Center, Community Activities Center, Central Fire Station, Big Lots,

Grapevine Golf Course & Pro Shop, Waffle Way, and City Hall by November 26, and donations will be taken until December 21. Cash donations are also accepted and taken year round.

Individuals and community groups interested in helping wrap the Santa Cops toys for the children are most welcome! The community gift wrapping dates are December 5, 10, 12, and December 17, if necessary. The police officers will deliver the toys to the children's homes in time for Christmas. The Santa Cops Toy Shoppe, where the gift wrapping will take place, is located in the Grapevine Towne Center Shopping Center, State Highway 114 and State Highway 26/Ira E. Woods Avenue. The Toy Shoppe is located in Suite 124, south of Big Lots and just north of Aaron's

Rent-A-Center. Check the Grapevine Police Department's facebook page for update.

For the past several years Willhoite's Restaurant, 432 S. Main Street has hosted a Santa Cop toy drive. Willhoite's collects toys for Santa Cops all during the month of December, but on one special evening, Thursday, December 12, guests are invited to Willhoite's to bring toys, fellowship, and share the joy of Christmas with Grapevine Police officers.
